



Frequently Asked Questions

About Jr. Rodeo Camps:

Our mission is to provide a fun, educational and positive rodeo experience. Camp curriculum includes an introduction to roughstock events with an emphasis on safety, fundamentals, chute procedures, and riding equipment. The instructors will provide an overview of injury prevention, fitness, nutrition, as well as an introduction to PRCA business and goal setting. Instructors provide encouragement to participants as they pursue both their rodeo careers and scholastic endeavors.

Important Information:

- Camps are available for children ages 8+ to attend. All attendees must be members of Jr. Rodeo.
- Jr. Rodeo camps are scheduled and will be selected based upon frequency for your geographic location.
- We require use of an arena, with bucking chutes at no cost to PRCA (portable chutes may be used).
- These are ground camps, we do not offer live buckouts. However, we do use livestock in our teaching.
- Please complete the host application and submit for consideration for 2020 to get a better idea of what we look for when selecting camp hosts.
- Our intent is to have at least one camp per month. If possible, based upon location, we will try to host more.

PRCA Responsibilities:

- Creation of promotional flyer and artwork (website, social networks, etc.)
- Manage all registrations including insurance coverage (PRCA will name host and arena as additional insured at no additional cost)
- PRCA will promote Jr. Rodeo camps via the website, social networks, and email campaigns.
- PRCA to provide training devices if required.
- PRCA to provide instructor stipends.

Joint Responsibilities:

- PRCA and host to recruit instructors and guest speakers
- PRCA and host to provide goody bags for all participants
- PRCA and host to develop a joint press release
- PRCA and host to take photos and video of the camp and share once the camp is completed
- If easily available PRCA and host to secure use of livestock

Host Responsibilities:

- Host to promote the camp in the geographic region
- Host to provide A/V equipment (TV/projector, screen, and PA system)
- Host to recruit and provide volunteers (5-10 for the duration of camp)
- Host to secure hotel/lodging for instructors and PRCA rep (four rooms for three nights maximum, depending on total number of attendees)
- Host fee paid to PRCA at least 30 days in advance
- Host is responsible for coordination of media interviews/requests
- Host to provide a meal during the camp for participants and instructors
